NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC) POLICY OF NAVSARI AGRICULTURAL UNIVERSITY (NAU)

(Ref.: Minutes of Vice Chancellors Conclave held on 22 Sep 2015 at NCC Directorate Gujarat, Dadra Nagar Haveli, Diu and Daman, Ahmedabad; No. 140/Misc/NCC/Trg(A), dated 8 Oct 2015)

1. BRIEF HISTORY OF NCC IN INDIA:

During First World War, Britishers created the University Corps with an aim for second line of defence and also to have a large pool of trained youth available for employment into the Armed Forces. NCC in India was conceptualised and raised before independence, mainly with an aim to groom the youth, boys and girls both, nurture them and channelize their energy towards nation building by making them responsible citizen.

After independence, the present day NCC came into existence on 16 Apr 1948, through XXXI Act of Parliament. NCC was formally inaugurated on 15 Jul 1948. The Girls Division of the NCC was raised in Jul 1949. On 1 Apr 1950, Air Wing was raised, with one Air squadron each at Bombay and Kolkata. The Naval Wing of the NCC was raised in Jul 1952, thus completing the true representation of all services in the Corps.

Today the NCC has an enrolled strength of more than 13 Lakhs cadets and it basically comprises of two divisions of all the three Services i.e. the Senior Division (SD) for boys and Senior Wing (SW) for girls from colleges and the Junior Division (JD) for boys and Junior Wing (JW) for girls from schools. The Motto of NCC is 'Unity and Discipline'.

The NCC being the largest youth organization of the world and has assumed a very important place in the country in grooming the youths to be a leader of tomorrow. Living upto its motto i.e. "Unity and Discipline" it strives in its endeavour to meet all its objectives by bringing together the vibrant youths of the entire country.

2. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF NCC:

2.1 The aims of NCC are

- I. To develop character, courage, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and sportsmanship and the ideals of selfless service among the youth to make them responsible citizens.
- II. To create human resource of organized, trained and motivated youth, to provide leadership in all walks of life always available for the service of the Nation.
- III. To create suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the Armed Forces.

2.2 Objectives of the NCC are

- I. Reach out to the maximum youths through various institutions.
- II. Make NCC as an important part of the society.
- III. Teach positive thinking and attitude to the youths.
- IV. Become a main source of National Integration by making NCC as one of the greatest cohesive force of our nation irrespective of any caste, creed, religion or region.
- V. Mould the youth of the entire country into a united, secular and disciplined citizens of the nation.
- VI. Provide an ideal platform for the youth to showcase their potential in nation building.
- VII. Instill spirit of secularism and united India by organizing National Integration Camps all over the country.
- VIII. Reach out to the youths of friendly foreign countries through Youth Exchange Programmes (YEP).

3. ORGANIZATION OF THE NCC:

The NCC is a voluntary organization which is administered through the Ministry of Defence. The Defence Secretary is overall in charge, who is responsible to the Govt of India for efficient functioning of the NCC and other matters.

At the Headquarters level, this organization is headed by an officer of the rank of Lieutenant General who is responsible for the functioning of the NCC in the country.

There are 17 Directorates located in the state capitals headed by an officer of the rank of a Major General/Brigadier or equivalent from the three Services. Depending upon the size of the state and growth of NCC in the states, Directorates have up to 14 Group Headquarters under them through which they exercise their command and control of the organization in the state. Each group is headed by an officer of the rank of Brigadier/Colonel or equivalent known as Group Commander.

Each NCC Group Headquarters controls 5-7 NCC units/battalions, commanded by Colonel/Lieutenant Colonel or equivalent. Each battalion consists of companies which are commanded by the Associate NCC Officers (ANO) of the rank of Lieutenant, Captain or Major. In all, there are 96 Group Headquarters in the country who exercise control over a network of 668 Army Wing Units, 60 Naval Wing Units and 61 Air Squadrons.

There are two training establishments namely Officers Training Academy (OTA), Kamptee and Women Officers Training Academy (WOTA), Gwalior where professors from colleges and teachers from school are specially trained to impart training to the cadets as Associate NCC Officers (ANOs).

3.1 NCC Staff:

NCC is staffed by the following

- I. Regular officers drawn from the three services Army, Navy and Air force.
- II. Whole Time Lady Officers (WTLO), who are from NCC.
- III. Associate NCC officers (ANO), who are professors and teachers.
- IV. Girl Cadet Instructors (GCI), who are from NCC.
- V. Permanent Instructional (PI) Staff from Army, Navy and Air force.
- VI. Civilian Gliding Instructors.
- VII. Civilian Staff.

4. BRIEF HISTORY OF GUJARAT DIRECTORATE:

4.1 Birth of Gujarat State:

The State of Gujarat was formed from the former Greater Bombay State on 1 May 1960. Until then, every state had a circle headquarter. 1 Circle Cadet Corps Bombay was re-organized into 1 & 15 Circle Cadet Corps with the latter located at Ahmedabad, vide Government of India, Ministry of Defence letter No 1629/4/A/NCC/C(A-II)/1159/HQ/D(GS-III) dated 25 Apr 1960. Headquarter 15 Circle Cadet Corps started functioning at Ahmedabad from 09 May 1960. The designation of circle Commander was later changed to Director Cadet Corps, and his office renamed as Cadet Corps Directorate Gujarat on 4 Feb 1963.

4.2 Union Territories:

The union territories of Dadra & Nagar Haveli were grouped with NCC Directorate Gujarat vide Government of India, Ministry of Defence letter No 7861/NCC/PLG/022/US/D(GS-III) dated 28 Feb 1963. Subsequently, the territories of Diu & Daman were also included. Thus, the directorate is now responsible for the whole of Gujarat state and the union territories of Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Diu & Daman.

4.3 Compulsory NCC Training:

In 1962, NCC Training was made compulsory for all able bodied male students of the colleges. In order to carry out the additional task and to ensure effective command and control, the Government of India ordered the raising of NCC group HQ as a link between the Directorate and the units. Accordingly, the under mentioned NCC Group HQs were sanctioned for Gujarat vide Government of India, Ministry of Defence letter No 7741/NCC/PLG/1320-B/D (GS-VI) dated 10 Apr 1964. Subsequently, NCC Group HQ (C) Ahmedabad, was moved to Bhavnagar and designated as NCC Group HQ Bhavnagar vide Govt of India, Ministry of Defence letter No 5401/NCC/PLG/7037/D(GS-IV) dated 17 Dec 1964. NCC Group HQ (B), Ahmedabad. NCC Group HQ Bhavnagar and Surat were disbanded during re-organisation vide Directorate General NCC

letter No 1889/2/DG NCC/Planning dated 03 Feb 1977. A total of 20 units were also disbanded in the entire state. The Directorate today has four groups under command as under:

- I. NCC Group, Ahmedabad
- II. NCC Group, Baroda
- III. NCC Group, Rajkot
- IV. NCC Group, Vallabh Vidyanagar.

NCC activities are being conducted in 255 colleges and 425 schools in entire Gujarat. The present authorized strength of NCC in the state is 56040 cadets (Senior Division Boys, Junior Division Boys, Senior Wings Girls and Junior Wing Girls all included). NCC of NAU comes under 20 Gujarat Battalion, Navsari which is under NCC Group HQ, Baroda.

5. TRAINING IN NCC:

Training activities of NCC can be broadly classified as under

- I. Institutional Training: Training organized in schools and colleges as drill parades, lectures on common and military subjects on a weekly basis.
- II. Camp Training: Formal training organized as camps of 10-12 days duration.
- III. Attachment Training: Formal training organized by attachment with Army/Naval/Air force units or with Officer Training Academies like IMA and OTA.
- IV. Naval Wing Activities: Seamanship, Navigation, Communication, Naval Warfare are taught to cadets. Swimming, Scuba Diving and Wind Surfing are other interesting activities.
- V. Air Wing Activities: Airmanship, Aero modeling, Navigation, Air Frames, Aero Engines and Microlite Flying are taught to cadets.
- VI. Remount & Veterinary Activities: This activity is primarily meant for horsemanship and riding.
- VII. Adventure Training and Sports: These include mountaineering, sailing, parasailing, rafting, trekking, expedition, cycle expedition, desert safari, shooting and showjumping activities.
- VIII. Youth Exchange Programme (YEP): In this, selected cadets are sent to friendly foreign countries for a 10 day visit.

5.1 Types of Camps:

- I. Annual Training Camps (ATC): These are held within the state under the aegis of respective NCC Directorates and are of 12 days duration for senior boys/girls and 10 days for junior boys/girls.
- II. Centrally Organized Camps (COC): These are of an all India nature and are planned by HQ DGNCC in consultation with the Directorates nominated to conduct them.

The centrally organized camps are

- a. Basic Leadership Camps (BLC)
- b. Advance Leadership Camps (ALC)
- c. Army Attachment Camp (AAC)
- d. Thal Sainik Camp (TSC)
- e. Vayu Sainik Camp (VSC)
- f. Nau Sainik Camps (NSC)
- g. Adventure Courses
 - i. Rock Climbing Camp
 - ii. Mountaineering Course
 - iii. Para jumping/ Skydiving
 - iv. Water/ Snow skiing
 - v. White Water Rafting
 - vi. Camel Safari
 - vii. Sailing expeditions
 - viii. All India Trekking Expeditions
 - ix. Mount Everest Expedition
- h. National Integration Camps (NIC)
- i. Independence Day Camp (IDC)
- j. Republic Day Camp (RDC) and PM's Rally

6. INCENTIVES OF NCC TO THE CADETS:

Apart from grooming and preparing the youths for the future challenges in NCC, cadets are given various benefits in terms of job opportunities, scholarships and financial assistance in time of any tragedy while doing any NCC related activities. These incentives are announced from time to time by the Central and State Govts. These incentives are in the field of employment as well as academics and personal including medals, trophies, cash award, etc. The best incentive being the vacancy reserved for 'C' certificate holder cadets for the commission as officer in the Indian Army.

6.1 Concession in Employment:

- I. Specific vacancies in the Army, Air Force and Navy are reserved for NCC 'C' certificate holders. For officers there is no UPSC written exams. After application, the cadet is called directly for SSB interview, which he has to clear before final selection as per the merit list. The following vacancies are reserved by each service as officers:
 - a. Army: 64 seats per year at IMA and 100 seats per year at OTA
 - b. Navy: 06 seats per course through Naval SSB
 - c. Air Force: 10 % vacancies in all courses through Air Force SSB
- II. 5-10 % bonus marks for recruitment in ranks in Army, Navy and Air force.
- III. 2 to 10 % bonus marks for employment in Para Military Forces (Like BSF, ITBP, CRPF, CISF, NSG, NCR, IB, BPR, etc.) and Department of Telecommunication.

- IV. Can apply for gazetted post in CRPF if third division degree held by the cadet.
- V. Preference in State Services and also in private sectors.
- VI. Employment within NCC as Whole Time Lady Officer, Girl Cadet Instructor, Aero and Ship Modeling Instructor.
- VII. Preference in various state/central Govt examinations and interviews.

6.2 Financial Assistance/Scholarships:

Financial assistance and relief to cadets is provided by Cadet Welfare Society (CWS) in case of any injury to the cadet or to the Next of KIN (NOK), in case of any fatality during NCC related activities. Details of the financial assistance are:

6.3 Benefits provided by the CWS are:

- I. Scholarship to academically brilliant students.
- II. Grant of Best Cadet Award of Rs. 3500/- and 2nd Best Cadet Award of Rs. 2500/- at each Group level.
- III. Conduct sports and adventure activities.

6.4 CWS and SAHARA Scholarships:

- I. Cadets Welfare Society (CWS): CWS awards scholarship of Rs. 6000/- per cadet for 1000 NCC cadets every year.
- II. Sahara Scholarship: Sahara gives Rs. 30,000/- for Professional and Other categories and Rs. 12000/- for SD/SW.

6.5 Other Scholarships and Awards:

- I. COAS, CNS, CAS Scholarship
- II. DG NCC Scholarship and DG Personal Award
- III. Best Cadet Award (RDC)
- IV. Trophies, Prizes, Batons, Medals, Certificates, etc.

7 NCC CADETS OF NAU:

- I. All students meeting the quality requirements of age and qualification will be permitted to join NCC on a voluntary basis through selection.
- II. No Student of NAU can offer himself for enrolment as cadet
 - a. Unless having a good character
 - b. Unless he is a citizen of India or a subject of Nepal
 - c. Unless he is under the age of 26 years
 - d. Unless he is on the roll of N M College of Agriculture OR ASPEE College of Horticulture and Forestry
 - e. Unless he fulfills standard of physical fitness in height, chest measurement and other respects as may be specified by the Ministry of Defence, Govt of India.
 - f. If he has, at any time, been convicted of an offence involving moral turpitude.
 - g. If he has been dismissed from University, NCC, TA or Indian Armed Forces.
- III. Medically or physically unfit and undisciplined students are not allowed to enroll in NCC or may be expelled as and when found appropriate by ANO/Commanding Officer.
- IV. The present authorized strength of NAU is as follows:

N M College of Agriculture	54 (33% Girls)
ASPEE College of Horticulture and Forestry	53 (33% Girls)

- V. The period of enrolment of cadet with NCC is for three years.
- VI. All NCC cadets will be required to attain the institutional training regularly. A cadet has to undergo 85 annual sessions of NCC trainings.
- VII. All NCC cadets shall attain the NCC camps (State and National level) as per derailment by the ANO/Commanding Officer of the unit:
- VIII. Cadet is to maintain exemplary discipline and set the high standards of NCC.
- IX. Cadets attaining NCC activities will be considered on duty and their attendance will be marked accordingly.
- X. In case a cadet is unable to appear for any exam due to dates coinciding with NCC activities of National importance he will be permitted to appear for the exam on a deferred date. Cadets should not be permitted to opt out of NCC till completion of mandatory years without the permission of Principal duly recommended by ANO. Such withdrawal preferably be on medical or transfer reasons only.

- XI. An NCC Cadet transferred from one institute to another with NCC will be allowed to continue in NCC till he completes his mandated years to obtain the required NCC certificates.
- XII. NCC Cadets attaining camps and thus missing out studies would be awarded presence in lectures/practicals. The internal examinations like hourly, internal practical etc. is to be taken as missing exams afterwards. For the same office orders shall be issued by the respective principals on recommendations of the ANO.
- XIII. As per the ICAR guidelines, NCC is as a regular course (OTH 1.1, 0+1) upto sixth semester and 75 % attendance is mandatory to attend any camp, appear for 'B' or 'C' certificate examinations.
- XIV. No academic activity like regular or extra classes, examination, missing examination or any co-curricular activity should be scheduled on Saturdays due to students' extensive involvement in NCC parades.
- XV. In case a cadet is not able to attend a parade, consent in writing has to be sought from the ANO in advance.
- XVI. All accessories (Uniform, Belt, Beret, Insignia, Cap Base, Hackle, Title shoulder, Line yard, DMS, etc.) given to the cadet are the property of the university/the unit. The cadets will be responsible to maintain them properly and return the same at time of completion of the NCC training or termination from NCC.
- XVII. For the cadets staying as hoteliers, the Assistant Rector/Rector/Principal will be responsible as the local guardian of the cadet.
- XVIII. Every year, ten best cadets from each college will be appreciated in the Annual Gathering. In addition to this the achievers in different camps and NCC activities during the year will also be facilitated in the annual gathering programme. Such cadets will be bestowed with a separate certificate of appreciation by NAU.

8 ASSOCIATE NCC OFFICER (ANO) OF NAU:

- I. The following conditions need to be fulfilled for enrollment as an ANO of NAU
 - a. He should have good character.
 - b. Citizen of India or a subject of Nepal.
 - c. Age: Not less than 21 years and more than 42 years.
 - d. Should satisfy the physical fitness standards as specified by MOD, Govt of India.
 - e. Should have minimum of 3 years' service in the regular teaching staff of NAU. Those who have served in NCC as under officer or have obtained "B" and "C" certificate, 3 years conditions may be waived by DG NCC.
 - f. Should not be involved in an offence of moral turpitude.
 - g. Should not have been dismissed from university, Corps of Indian Territorial Force or TA or Indian Armed Forces.

- II. The power of grant of commission, promotion and extension of service are vested with the Ministry of Defence (MOD), Govt of India which may authorize the appointment of any person for appointment.
- III. An officer shall be posted as ANO of the Senior Division of the NCC of NAU by the Ministry of Defence, Govt of India.
- IV. NCC activities being undertaken by ANOs as lectures/parade/military training should be endorsed in service book and to be included in the workload.
- V. Presently two officers from NAU have been appointed as ANO by Ministry of Defence, Govt of India.

- VI. Method of appointment, period of appointment, extension, etc. for ANO in NAU shall be as per the NCC Act, 1948.
- VII. All selected ANOs must be made available for undergoing the Pre Commission Course (PRCN) for three months, Refresher Course for one month at Officer Training Academy (OTA), Kamptee for gents and WOTA, Gwalior for ladies within two years of selection and these courses shall be counted as academic course and duly endorsed in the service book of the officer.
- VIII. Officers of the NCC when in uniform and attending an authorized parade or an annual camp or any activity related to NCC shall be given the same courtesies as officers of the Indian Army.
- IX. On recommendation in the conclave and minutes as reference Point No. 24 (b), the honorarium of ANOs NAU are to be revised and due correspondences should time to time be made to Govt of Gujarat for the same.
- X. ANOs will be made available for NCC camps as per requirements by the Commanding Officer of NCC Unit.
- XI. The ANOs are commissioned officers and should be bestowed with office of appropriate size along with a store room.
- XII. The Commission Rank, period of service as ANO and participation in various state and National level NCC activities will be endorsed in the service book of the individual.
- XIII. One assistant cum clerk should be provided for routine work of NCC of NAU.
- XIV. The duties and responsibilities of ANOs are of essential kind by maintaining stores, arms and ammunitions, conducting institutional training, parade, camps, military training etc. and be provided rent free quarter in the university campus on essential basis.

- XV. As per the NCC Act 1948 part V 23 (2) and (4) An officer of the Senior Division who is to be transferred, the unit head shall submit his application in writing, through proper channel to the Vice Chancellor of the University and shall, in the application, state his reasons for the transfer. The Vice Chancellor shall then forward the same through the State Govt to the MOD, Govt of India, together with his recommendations. If the proposed transfer is to a unit of the Senior Division in another State, the Ministry of Defence, Govt of India, shall consult the State Govt in whose jurisdiction the unit is located, and obtain their concurrence to the transfer. Concurrence of Additional Director General, NCC Directorate Gujarat, Dadar Nagar Haveli, Daman and Diu will be taken prior to transfer of an ANO from a college as per orders by the State Govt.
- XVI. As per the epistle No. 127/G, dated 29 May 2012 to the Chief Electoral Officer by the commanding officer, ANOs are commissioned officers and are responsible for imparting military training. Hence, they will not be deputed for the election or any other duties without prior permission from unit and Ministry of Defence, Govt of India.

8.1 Duties of ANO of NAU:

- I. ANO is a role model for cadets on as well as off parade.
- II. ANO is responsible for the training, discipline and administration of NCC in NAU.
- III. ANO is responsible to maintain following documents :

- IV. Officer shall attend all the parades and Annual Camps.
 - V. Issue of clothing and Allowances applicable to cadets (Documentation & disbursement).
 - VI. Accounting and careful maintenance of clothing, stores, arms, ammunition, rations, etc.
 - VII. Ensure that all the cadets are regular for the NCC parades. Motivate more and more to join the NCC by giving the knowledge of various benefits of NCC.
 - VIII. Responsible to instill a sense of pride and spirit in the cadets. Always guide cadets to be good citizens by imbibing all good qualities of good citizens into them.
 - IX. To maintain discipline of the cadets under command and provide guidance to cadets on various aspects and assist cadet in development of cadet's personality.
 - X. Selection of cadets for various events like RDC, any other camp or NCC activity.
 - XI. ANO must know each and every cadet under his command thoroughly.
 - XII. ANO must be on parade well in time. Turnout must be paid special attention at all the times when ever putting it on.
 - XIII. An ANO must be well versed with current events taking place in India and in the world.
 - XIV. ANO should be aware of the NCC organization in the country, all imp appointments related to his unit, Directorate and DGNCC.

- XV. ANO should be aware of the various policies regarding training dictated by DGNCC.
- XVI. Special attention must be paid by the ANO to the controlled stores items of the unit.
- XVII. ANO shall act as connecting link between the NCC unit and the university.
- XVIII. Liaison with various agencies like Army, Police, Para Military Forces, Civil, etc. as and when required by the university or the unit.

8.2 Powers of ANO of NAU:

- I. As per Rule 26, sub rule (2) of NCC Act 1948, officers of the NCC when in uniform and attending an authorized parade or an annual camp shall be given the same courtesies as officers of the Indian Army.
- II. Officers shall exercise powers of command over all cadets in their unit.
- III. Officers of the Senior Division shall exercise such powers over Junior Commissioned Officers, Warrant Officers, and Non-Commissioned Officers of the Army, Chief Petty Officers, Petty Officers and Men of Indian Navy, Warrant Officers and Non-Commissioned Officers of the Indian Air Force, as the case may be posted or attached to their units as may be specified by the Government of India in the Ministry of Defence.
- IV. Officers of the Senior Division shall be junior to all officers of the Armed Forces and Territorial Army and whole-time National Cadet Corps commissioned officers of similar rank and among themselves shall take seniority according to the date of their commission in the Corps. Provided that period of service rendered by an officer of the Senior Division as a Commissioned Officer in the Armed Forces, Territorial Army and Jammu and Kashmir Cadet Corps or National Cadet Corps (Senior Division) shall count towards his seniority and promotion.

9 INFRASTRUCTURE AT NAU:

- I. NAU has following infrastructural facilities for NCC cadets of NAU:
 - a. Ground
 - b. Parade area
 - c. Gymnasium building
 - d. Sports complex
 - e. Store room for clothing and equipment
 - f. Classroom for institutional training
 - g. Audio-visual conference room for AV presentation, video show, meeting, etc.
 - h. Primary Health Centre
 - i. University Canteen
 - j. Auditorium
- II. The display board of NCC is placed on both the main entries of the University and also placed at both the colleges i.e. N M College of Agriculture and ASPEE College of Horticulture and Forestry.

10 FUTURE ROADMAP OF NCC IN NAU

- I. NAU is and will persistently promote NCC activities for the students to excel in their overall development in all spheres of life.
- II. The Academic Council of NAU has resolved compulsory NCC for all students who opt for the forestry discipline in graduation looking at the requirement of the course, akin nature of job in the forests and career perspectives.
- III. The intake capacity at under graduate level gets revised by the Govt time to time and the authorized strength of NCC remains the same. This situation leads to proportionally fewer opportunities to the students. Therefore NAU shall demand more vacancies from NCC so as to enable students take up NCC as maximum as possible.
- IV. Every year NAU celebrates national days with utmost zeal and patriotism. The programme of Independence Day and Republic Day are carried out with NCC parade. This shall continue in future too with a high moral and spirit towards nation.
- V. NAU shall build a full fledged obstacle training course for NCC. Technical guidance on construction of this obstacle training area at university ground is to be taken from 20 Gujarat Battalion, NCC, Navsari.
- VI. To motivate outstanding cadets, NAU shall endeavor various motivational activities time to time. The successful alumni of NAU will be called on for the same.
- VII. Presently only two colleges viz. 'ASPEE College Horticulture and Forestry' and 'N. M. College of Agriculture' are enrolled in NCC. The newly established colleges shall approach nearby NCC unit for their enrollment in NCC. The compiled list of such colleges shall also be submitted to Additional Director General, NCC, Gujarat with a request to allot NCC to colleges of NAU on priority basis.

11 HONORARY 'COLONEL COMMANDANT' TO THE VICE CHANCELLOR OF NAU:

The Vice Chancellor of NAU should be recommended to Ministry of Defence, Govt of India through proper channel for Honorary Rank of 'Colonel Commandant' looking to the profound proliferation of NCC activities
