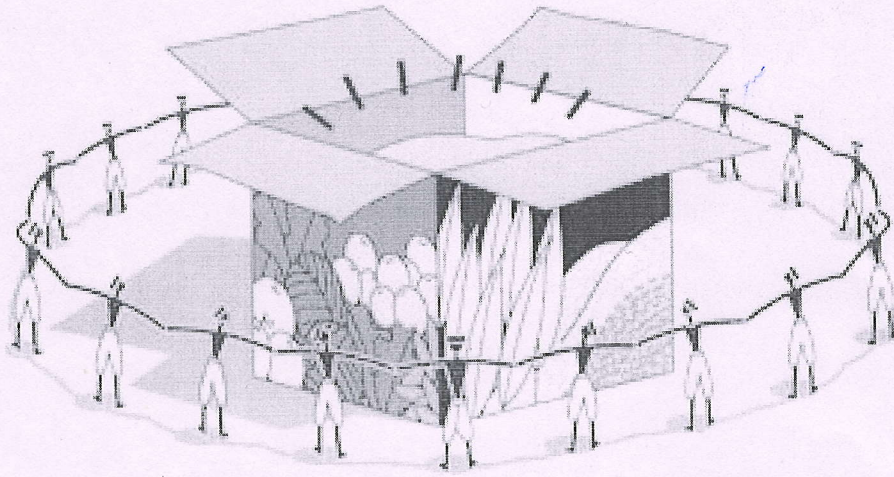

Background

In recent years, farmer-to-farmer extension has emerged as a viable option to improve the reach of public extension and rural advisory services. Built on the philosophy of 'self-help through mutual help', the Farmer Producer Organizations (FPO) are now on rise in various forms in India. Some of them like the ones promoted under the AMUL model also had remarkable success. There are many legal forms of organizations into which the primary producers like farmers, can organize themselves. A Producer Company (PC) is one such and relatively new legal entity of the producers of any kind viz. agricultural produce, forest produce, artisanal products, or any other local produce, where the members are primary producers. PC as a legal entity was enacted in 2003 as per Section 13A of the Indian Companies Act 1956. Since the above enactment, the PC has been hailed as the organizational form that will empower and improve the bargaining power, net incomes, and quality of life of small and marginal farmers/ producers in India.

Outreach professionals serving for dissemination of latest know-how to primary producers now need a new set of competencies to catalyze formation and formulation of farmer producer company. Such mastery demands effective discussion based capacity building programmes in this area. The PCs also need to choose their activity portfolio carefully keeping in mind the member centrality. This is being done in some parts of India vividly by private entities and Primary Agricultural Credit Society (PACS). There is also need for a central agency to promote PCs with grants and disseminate awareness about the concept and practices of PCs among farmer producers and other stakeholders. With this aim this Training Workshop has been designed by NARMI to sensitize the extension professionals on the strategies for promoting Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs). This workshop is meant to appraise the institutions which seek to promote and support Farmer Producer Organizations and link them to benefits under various programmes and schemes of the Central and State Government. This can bring elicit change, generate action, create understanding within and among the extension system.

Objectives

- To share the research results for peer review and learning
- To sensitize extension professionals about their facilitative role in formation, management and sustenance of Farmer Producer Organizations
- To impart necessary knowledge and skills for promoting FPOs

Core Content

- Research update on FPOs
- Formation, objects, management, member benefits, reserve, dispute resolution, etc.
- Producer company, robust framework for the small producers for effective market linking
- Challenges for producer company to farmer income
- FPO financing
- Building new business with FPO
- Policy barriers in agri-marketing and how to resolve them

Pedagogy

The Training Workshop delivery strategy consists of a blend of hands-on-exercises, lectures, discussions and exposure visits. However, the emphasis is on hands-on-exercises to enable participants to internalize the knowledge imparted in this workshop. This might necessitate extension of the class hours beyond the regular 0930 hours to 630 hours.

Programme Fee

For Non-ICAR participants the programme fee is ₹ 7,000/- which includes training kit/ material, board, lodging charges of NARMI Guesthouses/ Hostels excluding TAX/DA. The participants from ICAR there is no registration fee, however, they have to pay board and lodging charges at an approximate cost of Rs 600/- per day.

Travel

ICAR NARMI is located in Rajendranagar (17°8'49" N latitude and 78°24'42" East longitude) in Hyderabad about 20 km from the Hyderabad Rajiv Gandhi International Airport, Shamshabad 25 km from the Secunderabad Railway Station, 6 km from the Hyderabad Railway Station, 6 km from the Kacheguda Railway Station and 2 km from the Milimbur/ Mahatma Gandhi Bus Station (MGBS). From any of these alighting points, participants can take an auto rickshaw/ taxi/ car. Hyderabad has a salubrious climate. Travel TA and DA has to be met by the participants/ sponsoring organizations.
